

The Course



As the accompanying map shows, the course has been changed for the first time. From the same starting point, runners and walkers will head north on 19th eet, turn east on Nicholas Street, travel south on the Street to Capitol Avenue and turn east again to Abbott Drive.

From there to the turnaround point at Locust Street, they will enjoy a divided road with the median spearating northbound and southbound runners and walkers. The finish line is on Capitol Avenue, near 15th Street.

1991 Corporate Cup Route Changed to Abbott Drive

Other changes for this year's run include:

- (1) Spouses are eligible to enter for a \$5 fee.
- (2) No children or pets will be allowed on the course. If this rule is violated the entire AT&T team will be disqualified.
- (3) Runners who are able to complete the run in 50 minutes or less will start from an enclosed area at the front of the pack. Your team captain must report these people during registration so tickets for the entry can be issued.
- (4) Only company employees will be scored and considered for prizes (NO SPOUSES). All participants including spouses will receive Corporate Cup mugs.


Larry Kingery, Dept.






