



Health Tips From TLC— Congestive heart failure

Congestive heart failure is a condition in which the heart is unable to pump enough blood to the body or can only do so when too much fluid is backed up into the lungs. The cause is most often damage to the heart resulting from a heart attack. Other causes include high blood pressure, leaking heart valves, viruses, alcohol use, and birth defects.

Wh re the symptoms of congestive heart failure?

Shor so of breath—either with exertion or, more ominously, at rest—is the most common symptom. Weight gain and ankle swelling may occur. Fatigue and increased urination at night are common. A person with this condition may sometimes awake suddenly from a sound sleep gasping for breath.

What should you do if you have heart failure?

- Avoid excessive use of salt. Initially this may simply mean removing the salt shaker from the table, but later more severe salt restriction may be necessary.
- If you smoke, it is important that you stop.
- If are overweight, reducing to optimal weight may put less stress on your heart.
- Resting during the day may help.
- Because sudden weight gain may indicate worsening of heart failure, get in the habit of weighing yourself at home at least every other day.
- Usually a diuretic (water pill) will be prescribed, sometimes along with potassium.
- Digoxin may be prescribed to help the heart pump stronger, and an angiotensin-converting enzyme (ACE) inhibitor may make it easier for the heart to pump blood throughout the body. Long-acting nitroglycerin tablets

may also help.

When should you contact your doctor?

Any time you note a 2-day weight gain of 2 pounds or more

 If you feel dizzy or light-headed or if you black out, either spontaneously or after taking a medication

If you are unable to lie flat at night because of shortness of breath

Can you lead a normal life despite heart failure?

With the proper precautions and appropriate medications, heart failure can often be stabilized and you can return to your usual work. Untreated, heart failure may lead to progressive fluid accumulation, difficulty breathing, and further heart damage. A serious abnormal heart rhythm or even death due to inadequate circulation could then occur.



Avoid excessive use of salt.



Be aware of Sudden weight gain.






