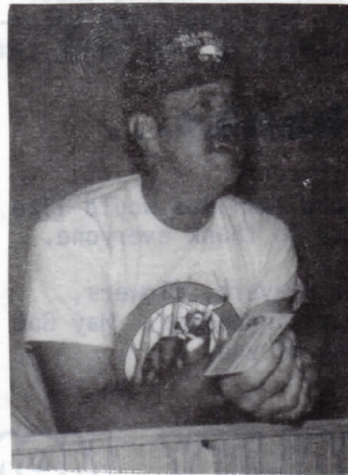
Please remember that all dolls are due back by October 28 and they will be on display in the auditorium after November 4.

Mark Saner, owner and operator of Millard Bait & Tackle, was the featured speaker at the September Sportsmen's Club meeting.



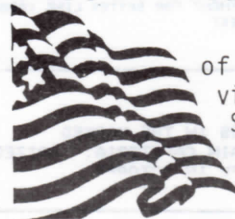
