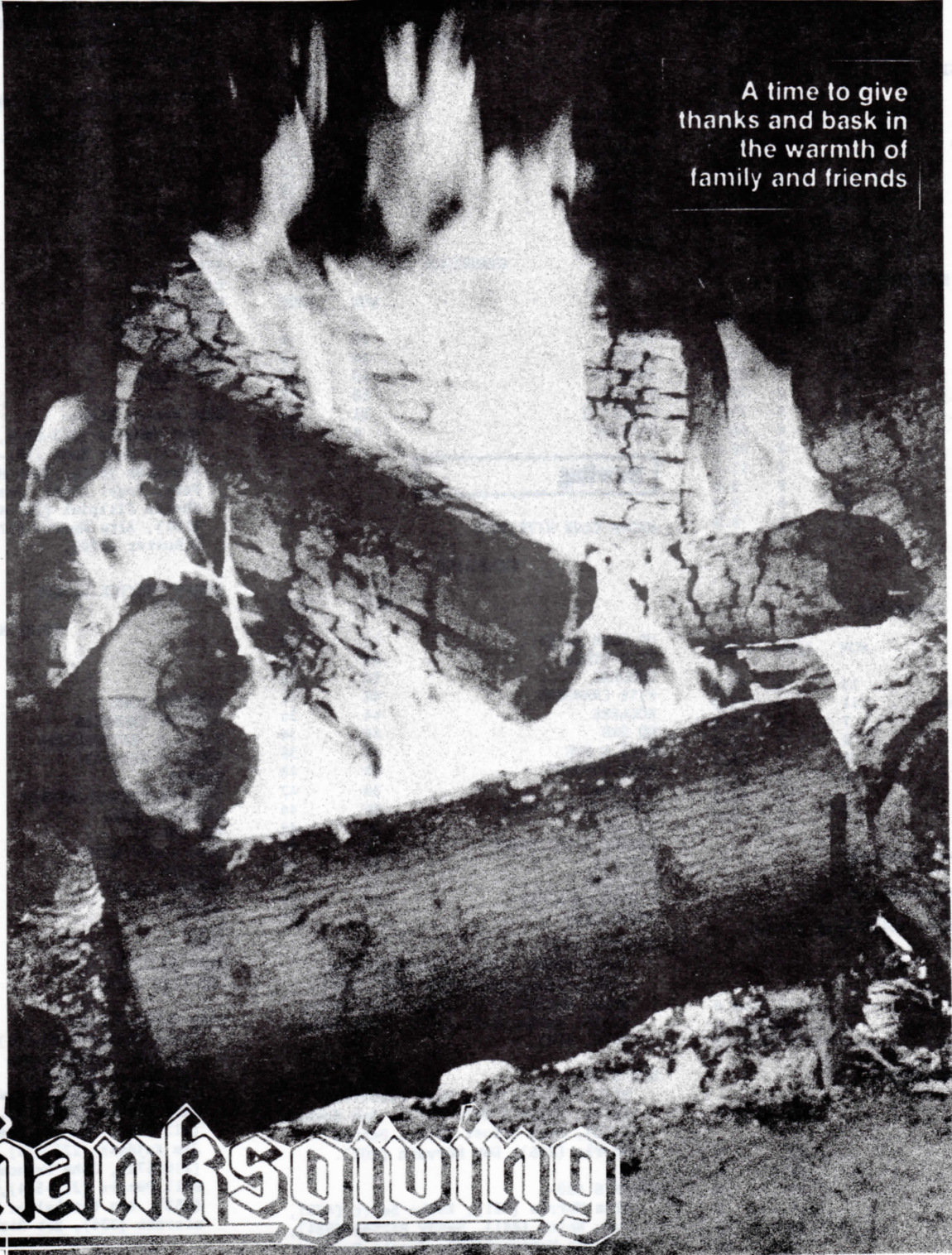

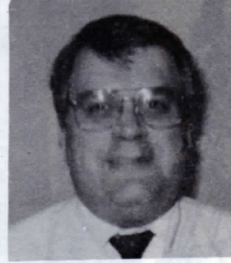
The BRAINSTORMERS would like to thank everyone involved with their projects. Without them, they could not have completed any of them.

It may seem a bit early to start thinking about trimming a Christmas tree, but not if you have a 50-foot tree to decorate with 5,000 ornaments and hundreds of lights.

That's the task at hand for volunteers at Western Heritage Museum as they prepare for CHRISTMAS AT UNION STATION. The 50-foot tree arrived from LaGrande, Oregon on November 13. A few days later, decorating began.

The annual Tree-Lighting Ceremony on Sunday, December 3 will signal the beginning of the holiday season in Omaha. That evening the Western Heritage Museum will open its doors at 6 p.m. Die Meistersingers will entertain visitors until 7 p.m. when Omaha Mayor P. J. Morgan will pull the switch to light the giant Christmas tree. Caroling, visits with Mr. and Mrs. Santa Claus and special holiday treats will be part of the traditional celebration.

Western Heritage Museum will be open for CHRISTMAS AT UNION STATION and will feature special weekend entertainment Friday evenings from 6 to 9 p.m. (December 8, 15 and 22); Saturday, December 9 and 16, from 12:30 to 5 p.m.; Saturday, December 23 from 12:30 to 4 p.m.; and Sunday, December 10 and 17 from 1 to 5 p.m. The tree may also be viewed during regular visiting hours from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday. The museum is closed on Mondays. Admission is \$3.00 for adults; \$2.50 for senior citizens; \$2.00 for children ages 5-12; children under 5 and museum members are free.

To prepare for CHRISTMAS AT UNION STATION, the museum will be closed to the public Saturday, December 2 until 6 p.m. Sunday, December 3 when the doors will open for the Tree-Lighting Ceremony. The museum will also be closed on December 24 and 25.

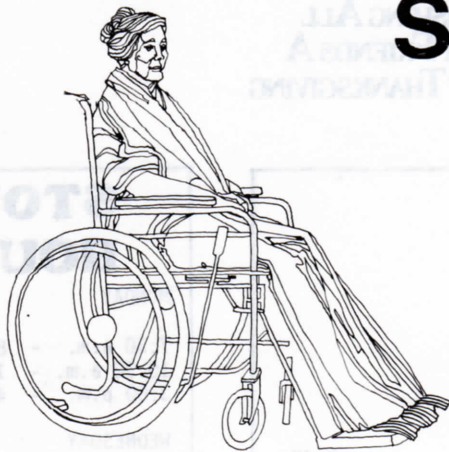

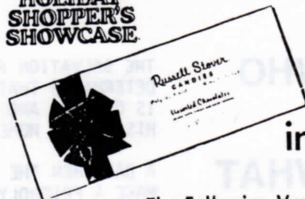
