## Pioneer volunteers answer the S-O-S for area preschoolers



PREVENT BLINDNESS.

For the third consecutive year, the Society to Prevent Blindness will offer their S-O-S (Screen-on-Site) program to Omaha Metro area pre-schools and day care centers.

With trained volunteers from Cornhusker Chapter 92 of the Telephone Pioneers of America, vision screenings are conducted for 4 & 5-year-olds on-site in licensed care facilities.

Vision problems occur in an estimated 1 of 20 preschool-aged children, yet a survey conducted by Prevent Blindness revealed that 54 percent of 3 to 5-year-olds have never had an eye exam.

Early detection and treatment are vital for the correction of some vision disorders, such as amblyopia (lazy eye). If this condition is not treated before the age of 6 or 7, permanent vision impairment can result.

The Nebraska Affiliate of the National Society to Prevent Blindness has been doing Pre-School Vision Screenings for over 20 years and organized vision screenings have proved a reliable way to identify children whose vision indicates the need for further evaluation.

The S-O-S program is done free as a community service. For more information, call the Society to Prevent Blindness at 551-2198.

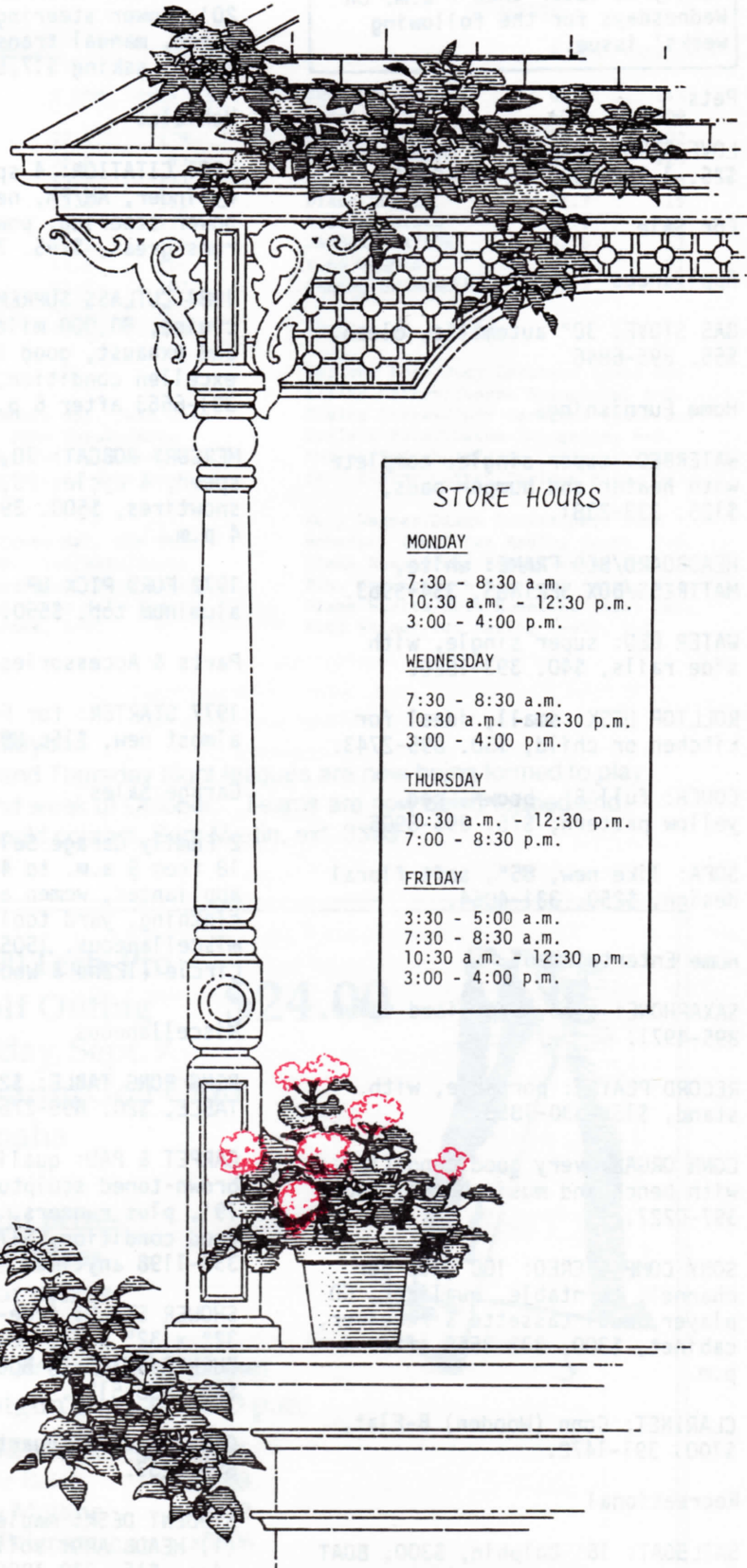
