Dick (The Mechanic) Cefrey's Entry Wins Super Stock Race

Dick is the mechanic for his son who attends Metro Tech. Together they purchased the go-cart and fixed it for their purposes. This was the sixth time the Cefrey's have gone to the Grand Nationals.

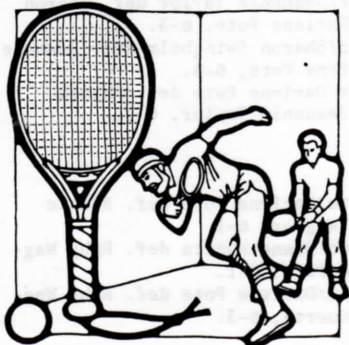
The elder Cefrey raced only once. He won that event and retired from competition. "I got lucky and I quit", Dick said.

In 1991, Dick and Ethan plan to enter the open class category in which the speeds are much faster. This also means there will be equipment changes to the vehicle. This is where Dick (the mechanic) excels.

The Grand Nationals, which are held yearly, hosted over 400 participants from the US, Mexico and British Columbia during the week of August 7.

The Cefrey's are regular participants in the Regional tournaments held weekly in Nebraska, Iowa, Texas and Minnesota.

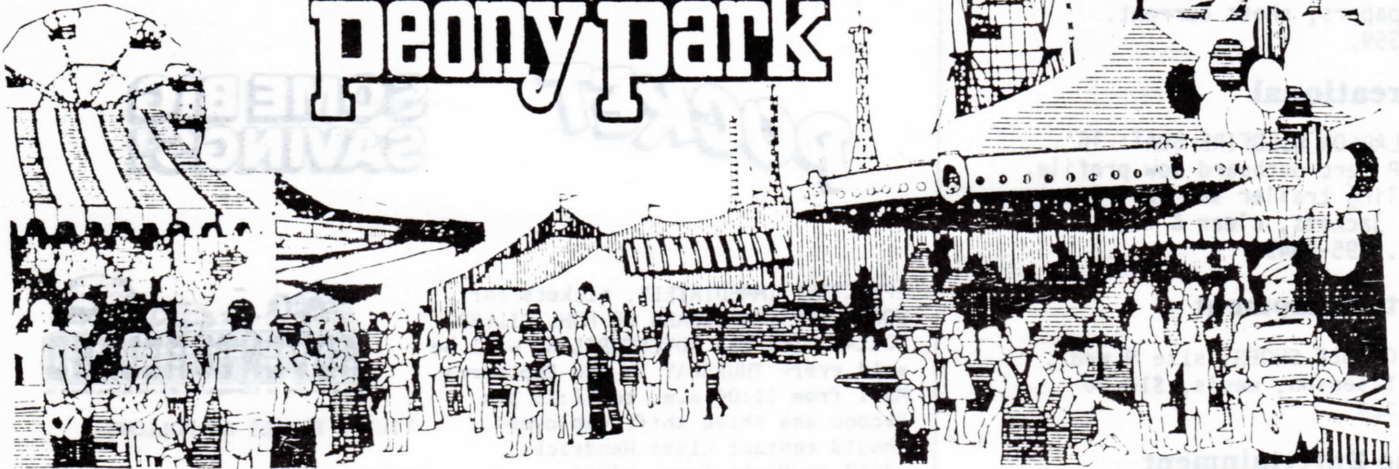
