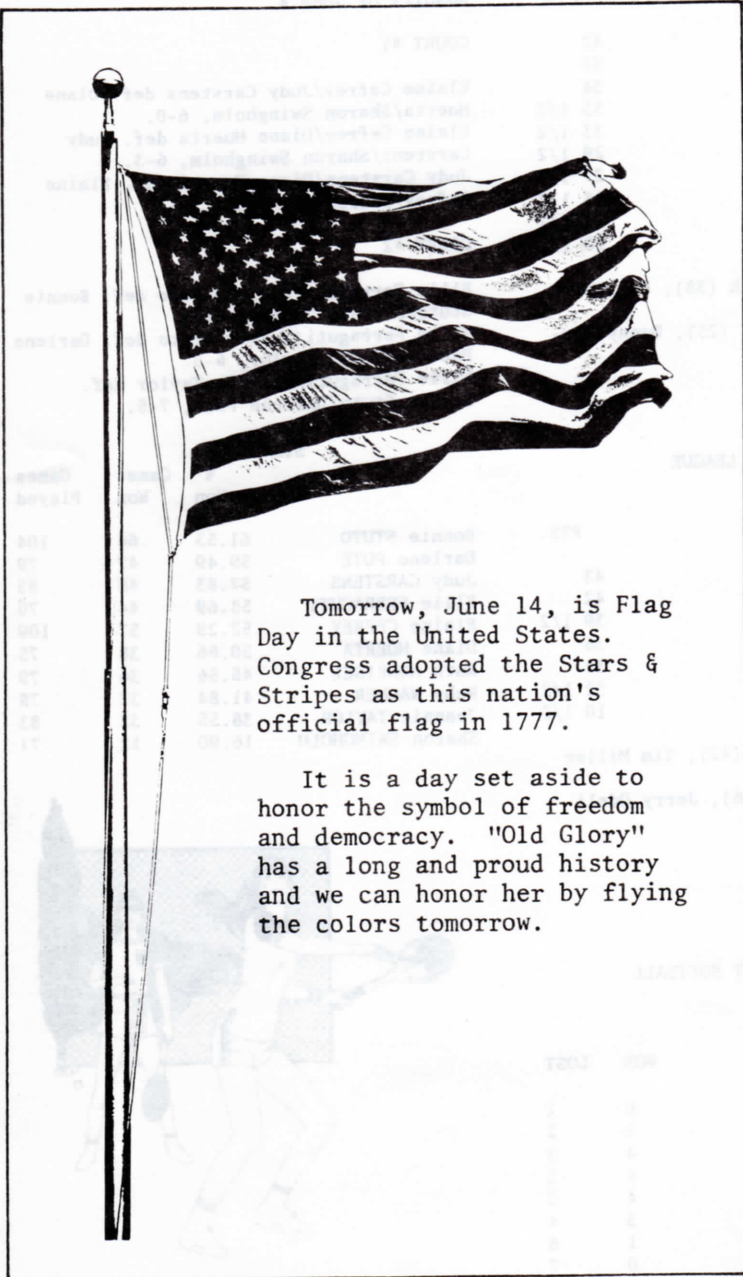


# Weoma Club NEWS

Trivia about sunburn:

1. Depending on the severity, sunburn may be associated with what?
2. How long does it take for the redness to peak in intensity?
3. What is the best method of preventing sunburn?
4. Sunscreens are a very effective means of sunburn prevention. How long before sun exposure should a sunscreen be applied to the skin?

#### ANSWERS:

1. Headache, nausea and chills.
2. 48-72 hours following exposure and may last as long as 7 to 10 days.
3. Avoiding prolonged exposure to the sun.
4. At least 30 minutes before exposure.
5. Premature wrinkling, aging of the skin and skin cancer.

### SAFETY BELT USE

Traffic safety is wellness issue. No matter what season, we are combating conditions that increase our risks on streets and highways. With summer travel and family vacations coming up, it is a good time to take a look at driving habits.

Fifty percent of unbelted motor vehicle fatalities and severe injuries could have been prevented if victims had been wearing their safety belts.

If every driver and passenger in the United States would wear safety belts during every trip in a vehicle...

- About 17,000 lives would be saved every year.
- The severity of 4 million personal injuries would be reduced every year.
- \$20 billion dollars in costs incurred through motor vehicle accidents would be substantially reduced every year.
- The total number of motor vehicle accidents would probably decrease.
