## Trivia about lung cancer

- 1. What are the earliest symptoms of lung cancer?
- 2. What is the most common symptom?
- 3. What is the second most-frequent symptom?
- 4. Are pneumonia or bronchitis symptoms of lung cancer?
- 5. What are the most widely-used test and the best screening device for cancer?

#### **ANSWERS**

- A cough, wheeze or an ache. That's why it's easy to shrug them off as minor irritants.
- A cough which is likely to occur when a growing cancer blocks an airway. The smoker coughs as if trying to get rid of a foreign object stuck in the lung.
- Chest pain. It occurs as a persistent ache that may or may not be related to coughing.
- 4. Recurring attacks may also signal the early presence of cancer.
- 5. The chest X-ray. However, the smallest tumor that X-ray can identify is about 1/2 inch in diameter.

# Dietary Guidelines for Better Eating and Better Health

Good nutritional habits based on moderation and variety can help keep you healthy and even improve your health. How do you successfully choose and prepare the foods that are best for you and your family? Listed below are guidelines intended for the general population. These guidelines are not intended for individuals with special dietary needs due to disease or conditions that interfere with normal nutrition.

EAT A VARIETY OF FOODS. A variety of foods daily includes a selection of fruits, vegetables, whole grain and enriched breads, cereals and grain products, milk, cheese, yogurt, meats, poultry, fish, eggs and legumes.

MAINTAIN YOUR IDEAL WEIGHT. Avoid too much fat, saturated fat and cholesterol. Choose lean meat, fish and poultry; moderate your use of eggs and organ meats such as liver; limit your intake of butter, cream, hydrogenated margarines, shortenings and coconut oil, and foods made from such products; trim excess fat off meats; bake broil or boil rather than fry; read labels to determine amount and types of fat contained in foods.

EAT FOODS WITH ADEQUATE STARCH AND FIBER. Substitute starches for fats and sugars, select foods that are good sources of fiber and starch such as whole grain breads and cereals, fruits and vegetables, beans, peas and nuts.

AVOID TOO MUCH SUGAR. Use less of all sugars including white sugar, brown sugar, raw sugar, honey and syrups; eat less of foods containing these sugars, select fresh fruits or fruits canned without sugar or with light syrup rather than heavy syrup. Read food labels for clues on sugar content. If the names sucrose, glucose, maltose, dextrose, lactose, fructose or syrups appear first, then there is a large amount of sugar.

AVOID TOO MUCH SODIUM. Cook only with small amounts of added salt. Add little or no salt to food at the table.

IF YOU DRINK ALCOHOL, DO SO IN MODERATION.



# Practice Makes Perfect

Quitting cigarette smoking is tough, like learning to ride a bike. Remember? You fell off several times before you stayed up. On your first ride, you may have only gone down the driveway, but you stuck with it. Your first time quitting smoking, you may only go a short distance. But like bike riding, you just have to get back up and try again.

Most ex-smokers try to quit at least three times before they succeed—some even more. Like everything that's worth doing, quitting smoking is worth the effort.
