WIN WITH SAFETY!

Heart disease is the No. 1 killer in America. In 1988 heart and blood-vessel diseases killed nearly one million Americans. Of the current U.S. population one in four suffer some form of cardiovascular disease. Many of the victims of this deadly disease are workers in our industries.

CPR training can substantially reduce the number of lives that are lost to heart disease. The greatest predictor of increased survival for the victim of sudden death is timed by the initiation of CPR by the first responder and early defibrillation.

The early history of CPR can be traced to the Bible with Elijah delivering rescue breathing to a child, and Vesalius in 1543 using controlled intermittent positive pressure. The process of CPR was first introduced to the medical community in 1960 by Dr. William Kovwenhoven. Donna Kock. Over the years, there has been an evolution in CPR training and there have been vast changes this past decade to make it more adaptable to the non-medical professional. 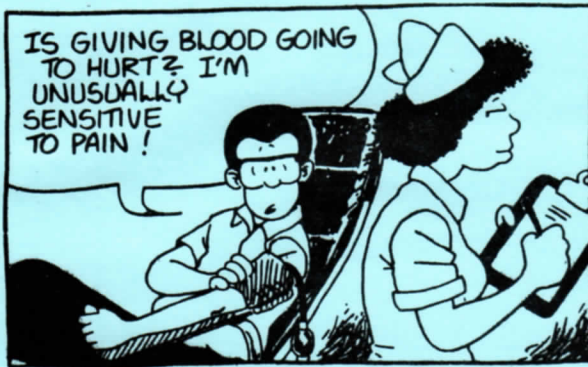

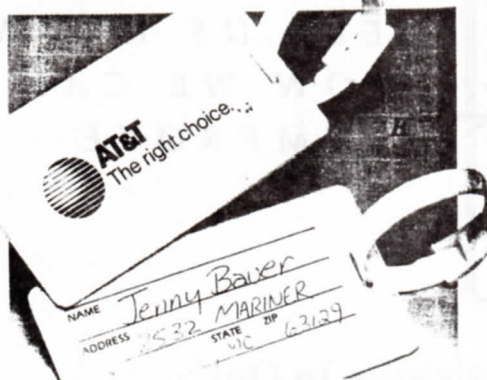
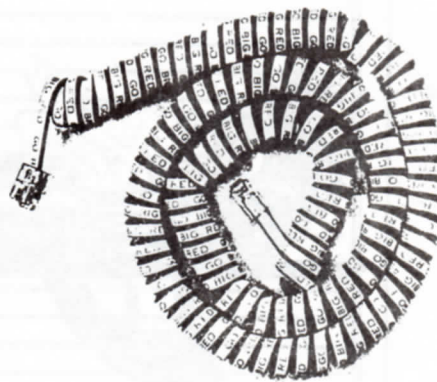
